• **contemporary** - belonging to the same period of time,

Scientists have found a fact documented by two contemporary sources.

• **display** - to present or hold up to view.

The peacock displayed its fan.

• extend - to stretch or spread (something) out to greater or fullest length

He extended the radio antenna in order to make the sound quality better.

• image - a reproduction of the form of a person or object, especially a sculptured likeness.

That child is the image of good health.

• **installation** - a system of machinery or other apparatus set up for use.

I have installed a new programme in my computer.

• **slide** - to coast on a slippery surface, such as ice or snow.

Children like waterslides very much.

• **turbine** - any of various machines in which the kinetic energy of a moving fluid is converted to mechanical power by the impulse or reaction of the fluid with a series of buckets, paddles, or blades arrayed about the circumference of a wheel or cylinder
