

Business: manufacturing and service

Word list

cater – maitinti

to provide food and drinks at a party, meeting, etc., especially as a job

• The restaurant *caters* for parties/banquets/receptions.

household goods – namų apyvokos daiktai

goods and products used within households. They are the tangible and movable personal property placed in the living rooms, dining rooms, kitchens, basements and other rooms of a house. Examples of household goods include air conditioners, baby items, baking dishes, beds/bedframes, etc.

industrial – pramoninis

relating to industry, factories, the people who work in factories, or the things made in factories.

• *industrial* development • There are thousands of *industrial* uses for plastic. • an *industrial* engineer •He had an **industrial accident**. [=an accident at work]

inventory – inventorius

a complete list of the things that are in a place

• an *inventory* of supplies • We made an *inventory* of the library's collection.

inseparable- neatsiejamas

not able to be separated

• One problem is *inseparable* from the other. • Growing up, the two of us were *inseparable*. [=we were very close friends; we spent a lot of time together] • We were *inseparable* friends.

inconsistency – nesuderinamumas, neatitikimas

the quality or fact of being inconsistent; the quality or fact of not staying the same at different times

• Police noticed *inconsistency* in his two statements. • Customers have been complaining about the *inconsistency* in the quality of service they have received.



involve- įpainioti

to have or include (someone or something) as a part of something

• Does this *involve* me? • The accident *involved* three cars. = Three cars were *involved* in the accident.• He told us a story *involving* life on a farm.

leisure – poilsis

time when you are not working: time when you can do whatever you want to do

• In his *leisure* [=*free time*, *spare time*], he paints and sculpts. • I'd like to write more, but I simply don't have the *leisure* (to do it).

manufacturing – gamyba

the industry or business of making products especially with machines in factories

• *Manufacturing* is central to the economy of the country. • They've created new jobs in *manufacturing*.

process – perdirbti

to change (something) from one form into another by preparing, handling, or treating it in a special way

• Food is often *processed* before it is packaged and sold. • He brought the film to be *processed*.

property –nuosavybė, turtas

something that is owned by a person, business, etc.

• Those books are my *property*. [=I own those books] • We are not responsible for the loss of **personal property**. • The library is **public property**. [=the library is owned by the city, town, or state]

raw material – žaliavos

or **feedstock** is the basic material from which a good product is manufactured or made, frequently used with an extended meaning. For example, the term is used to denote material that came from nature and is in an unprocessed or minimally processed state; e.g., raw latex, iron ore, logs, crude oil, air or seawater.



real estate – nekilnojamas turtas

Property consisting of land and the buildings on it, along with its natural resources such as crops, minerals, or water; immovable property of this nature; an interest vested in this; (also) an item of real property; (more generally) buildings or housing in general.

retail – mažmeninė prekyba

the business of selling things directly to customers for their own use

• She has a job in *retail*.

services – paslaugos

an organization, company, or system that provides something to the public

• the National Park Service • the National Weather Service

steel – plienas

a strong, hard metal made of iron and carbon

■ The beams are made of *steel*. — often used before another noun ■ *steel* bars ■ a *steel* mill [=a mill/factory where steel is made]

textiles – audiniai

a fabric that is woven or knit

• They import fine silk *textiles* from China. • a factory where *textiles* are made = a *textile* factory
